What is UDENYCA®?

UDENYCA is a prescription medicine used to help reduce the chance of infection due to a low white blood cell count, in people with certain types of cancer (non-myeloid), who receive anti-cancer medicines (chemotherapy) that can cause fever and low blood cell count.

Do not take UDENYCA if you have had a serious allergic reaction to pegfilgrastim or filgrastim products.


UDENYCA may help support your immune system while undergoing chemotherapy

CHEMOTHERAPY CAN DECREASE YOUR WHITE BLOOD CELL COUNT

Chemotherapy can help stop cancer cells from growing, but it can also lower your white blood cell count. A low white blood cell count can put you at risk for infection and a complication called febrile neutropenia, which is serious and can delay your chemotherapy treatments.

UDENYCA BOOSTS THE GROWTH OF YOUR WHITE BLOOD CELLS

UDENYCA increases your white blood cell count, which may help your body fight off infection and prevent febrile neutropenia.


How will I know if I have an infection?

IT'S IMPORTANT TO TAKE YOUR TEMPERATURE

A fever is a sign of infection. Call your healthcare team immediately if you experience a fever of or higher than 100.4 °F (38.0 °C). Take your temperature any time you don't feel well or as recommended by your healthcare team.

Other signs of infection include chills, shortness of breath, sore throat, stiff neck, and burning or pain with urination. Talk to your healthcare team about signs to look out for.

If you develop a fever, it is a medical emergency, and you must call your healthcare team immediately or go to the emergency room at your local hospital.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

What are possible side effects of UDENYCA? UDENYCA may cause serious side effects, including:

- **Spleen rupture:** Your spleen may become enlarged and can rupture. A ruptured spleen can cause death. Call your healthcare provider right away if you have pain in the left upper stomach area or your left shoulder.
- A serious lung problem called Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome (ARDS): Call your healthcare provider or get
 emergency care right away if you have shortness of breath with or without a fever, trouble breathing, or a fast rate
 of breathing.

What are possible side effects of UDENYCA? (Continued)

- Serious allergic reactions: UDENYCA can cause serious allergic reactions. These reactions can cause a rash over your whole body, shortness of breath, wheezing, dizziness, swelling around your mouth or eyes, fast heart rate, and sweating. If you have any of these symptoms, stop using UDENYCA and call your healthcare provider or get emergency medical help right away.
- Sickle cell crises: You may have a serious sickle cell crisis if you have a sickle cell disorder and receive UDENYCA. Serious sickle cell crises have happened in people with sickle cell disorders receiving pegfilgrastim that has sometimes led to death. Call your healthcare provider right away if you have symptoms of sickle cell crisis such as pain or difficulty breathing.

A quick guide to the UDENYCA autoinjector

Your healthcare provider will show you how to prepare and inject the UDENYCA autoinjector.

This quick guide does not replace the Instructions for Use. Please refer to it before administering UDENYCA. Talk to your healthcare provider or pharmacist if you have any questions.

Only adults can self-inject UDENYCA with the autoinjector.

BEFORE GETTING STARTED

Make sure that you have these supplies ready:

- 1 UDENYCA autoinjector
- 1 alcohol wipe
- 1 cotton ball or gauze pad
- 1 FDA-approved sharps disposal container.


Take the UDENYCA autoinjector out of the refrigerator and bring to room temperature 30 minutes before use.

- Do not warm the autoinjector in any other way. For example, do not warm in a microwave, in hot water, or in direct sunlight
- Dispose of autoinjectors that have been left out at room temperature (68-77 °F) for more than 48 hours

Inspect your autoinjector and do not use if:

- The medicine appears discolored or cloudy
- The medicine contains lumps, flakes, or particles
- It has been dropped, crushed, or damaged in any way
- It is expired

ADMINISTERING UDENYCA




CHOOSE

Choose an injection site and **clean** it with an alcohol wipe. Stay 2 inches away from the navel if injecting into the abdomen. Clean and dry your hands.



REMOVE


With the clear cap of the autoinjector facing up, **pull** the cap straight off.



PRESS

Place the gray needle guard against your skin at a 90° angle.

Press the autoinjector firmly against the skin and you will hear the first "click."



HOLD

Keep holding the autoinjector firmly against your skin until the orange indicator stops moving and you hear the second "click."

After you hear the second "click," continue to hold the autoinjector in place and count to 5.



FLASHING GREEN:

The on-body injector is working properly. **Do not** remove the on-body injector if the status light is flashing green.



SOLID GREEN (OR OFF):

Signals dose delivery is complete. Check to see if fill indicator reads empty.



FLASHING RED:

On-body injector error. If you hear beeping at any time, check the status light. If it is flashing red, call your healthcare provider right away as you may need a replacement dose.

- Allergies to Acrylics (UDENYCA ONBODY™ only): The on-body injector (OBI) for UDENYCA uses acrylic adhesive. If you have had reactions to acrylic adhesives, use of this product may result in a significant reaction.
- Kidney injury (glomerulonephritis): UDENYCA can cause kidney injury.
 Call your healthcare provider right away if you develop any of the following symptoms:

- Swelling of your face or ankles
- Blood in your urine or dark colored urine
- You urinate less than usual.
- Increased white blood cell count (leukocytosis): Your healthcare provider will check your blood during treatment with UDENYCA.

A quick guide to the UDENYCA on-body injector



The day you receive chemo, your on-body injector will be applied by your healthcare provider.



The day after chemo, your dose of UDENYCA will automatically be delivered about 27 hours after application.




AFTER YOUR PROVIDER APPLIES THE UDENYCA ON-BODY INJECTOR



MONITOR YOUR ON-BODY INJECTOR

For the next 27 hours, occasionally check the status light for at least 10 seconds. **Confirm it's flashing green.** If applied on the back of your arm, a caregiver must be available to check.



OBSERVE THE INJECTION

Before your injection begins, the on-body injector needle will automatically insert into your skin.


During the injection, the on-body injector will flash a fast, green light and you may hear the pump working. It will take just 5 minutes for your dose of UDENYCA to be delivered.



CONFIRM INJECTION IS COMPLETE

When the injection is complete, a long beep will sound, and the status light will turn solid green.

Confirm your injection is complete by checking to see that the status light is **solid green** or has switched off.



ENSURE YOUR ON-BODY INJECTOR IS EMPTY

Do not grasp the on-body injector itself to try and pull it off of your body. Instead, grab the edge of the adhesive and slowly peel the device off.

Check to see if your on-body injector is empty. You should see a black line next to the **empty** indicator.

If you hear beeping at any time, check the status light. If it is flashing red, call your healthcare provider right away.

What are possible side effects of UDENYCA? (Continued)

- Decreased platelet count (thrombocytopenia): Your healthcare provider
 will check your blood during treatment with UDENYCA. Tell your healthcare
 provider if you have unusual bleeding or bruising during treatment with
 UDENYCA. This could be a sign of decreased platelet counts, which may
 reduce the ability of your blood to clot.
- Capillary Leak Syndrome: UDENYCA can cause fluid to leak from blood vessels into your body's tissues. This condition is called "Capillary Leak Syndrome" (CLS). CLS can quickly cause you to have symptoms that may become life-threatening. Get emergency medical help right away if you develop any of the following symptoms:

- Swelling or puffiness and are urinating less than usual
- Trouble breathing
- Swelling of your stomach-area (abdomen) and feeling of fullness
- Dizziness or feeling faint
- A general feeling of tiredness

What are possible side effects of UDENYCA? (Continued)

- Myelodysplastic syndrome and acute myeloid leukemia: If you have breast cancer or lung cancer, when UDENYCA is used with chemotherapy and radiation therapy, or with radiation therapy alone, you may have an increased risk of developing a precancerous blood condition called myelodysplastic syndrome (MDS) or a blood cancer called acute myeloid leukemia (AML). Symptoms of MDS and AML may include tiredness, fever, and easy bruising or bleeding. Call your healthcare provider if you develop these symptoms during treatment with UDENYCA.
- Inflammation of the aorta (aortitis): Inflammation of the aorta (the large blood vessel that transports blood from the heart to the body) has been reported in patients who received pegfilgrastim. Symptoms may include fever, abdominal pain, feeling tired, and back pain. Call your healthcare provider if you experience these symptoms.
- Bone Imaging (Nuclear Imaging): The formation of certain blood cells may increase and can be associated with short term changes in bone imaging. Your doctor should consider this when interpreting bone imaging results.
- Allergies to Acrylics (UDENYCA ONBODY only): The on-body injector (OBI) for UDENYCA uses acrylic adhesive. If you have had reactions to acrylic adhesives, use of this product may result in a significant reaction.

The most common side effects of UDENYCA are pain in the bones, arms, and legs.
